ABOUT THE RIVER DISTRICT

The River District is a private, nonprofit business association charged with managing and promoting programs to strengthen the economic and cultural well-being of the area.

The 830-acre Property and Business Improvement District (PBID) was established in 1999 by a broad-based coalition of public and private property owners. Managed by The River District, the PBID is a special benefit assessment that supports enhanced services.

The PBID was approved for a ten-year term in 2024. The 2025-2034 Management District Plan outlines three categories of services to be provided by the PBID: safety & maintenance; planning, advocacy & communication; and administration & reserve. The services and programs provided by the PBID are above and beyond those provided by the City and County of Sacramento.

Location: Approximately 830 acres bounded roughly by the American River to the north; Sacramento River to the west; Union Pacific rail berm and C/D streets to the south; and 27th Street to the east.

Activities: Safety & Maintenance provides daily private security patrol, weekday trash abatement and on-call graffiti removal, regular liaison with the Sacramento Police Department, and occasional weed abatement. Planning, Advocacy & Communications activities facilitate a strong and organized voice to represent and convey a positive image of the assessed parcels. This program will advocate to advance the design and implementation of new roadway, transit, utility, and streetscape projects and advocate for open space, amenities, and other projects which specially benefit assessed parcels. The activities will aid in the attraction and retention of businesses, jobs, and employees.

Administration of District programs and activities is provided by The River District professional staff and Board of Directors.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

What a year 2024 has been! We have seen extraordinary progress in the district, with the grand opening of the May Lee State Office Complex - the largest all-electric, carbon neutral building complex in the country - as well as the Hanami Line, home to over 100 cherry blossom trees right on the banks of the Sacramento River.

We celebrated the first match in the Sacramento Roller Derby's new Bearhouse, where they will be hosting teams from all over the world! This new sports and entertainment facility has brought positive energy to the historic North 16 Street District. This stretch, once part of the first transcontinental road for automobiles in the United States (Lincoln Highway), has been neglected for far too long.

Our first newly constructed luxury apartment homes opened at The Hayley at Township 9, bringing new residents to the district, along with a beautiful clubhouse, two dog parks, and a brand new city park. New units have been completed at Mirasol Village, with just one block remaining under construction.

Along with the growth in residential and workforce populations, our district is seeing an increased need for commercial businesses and public transportation.

Construction began on the Dos Rios Light Rail Station late in the year, and Wilton Rancheria - Sacramento's only federally-recognized Native American tribe - announced they are investing in Sacramento Republic FC and building its new soccer stadium in the Railyards.

As an organization celebrating our 25th anniversary, we successfully renewed the River District PBID for another ten year term, and completed our first strategic plan, "Confluence: The Joining of Sacramento and its River Front," which provides a vision for the future of our neighborhood. As the city embarks on its project to update the River District Specific Plan, we aim not only to bring our vision to fruition, but to ensure that it is enshrined within the planning documents. This is the only way we can guarantee that our collective vision for this place becomes a reality.

The Sacramento River Water Intake Facility is a crucial infrastructure component in Sacramento that helps supply drinking water to the city. Located along the Sacramento River near the confluence with the American River, this facility pumps river water into the municipal water treatment system.



The facility includes stateof-the-art fish screens to prevent harm to local aquatic life, particularly protecting species like Chinook salmon and steelhead trout.

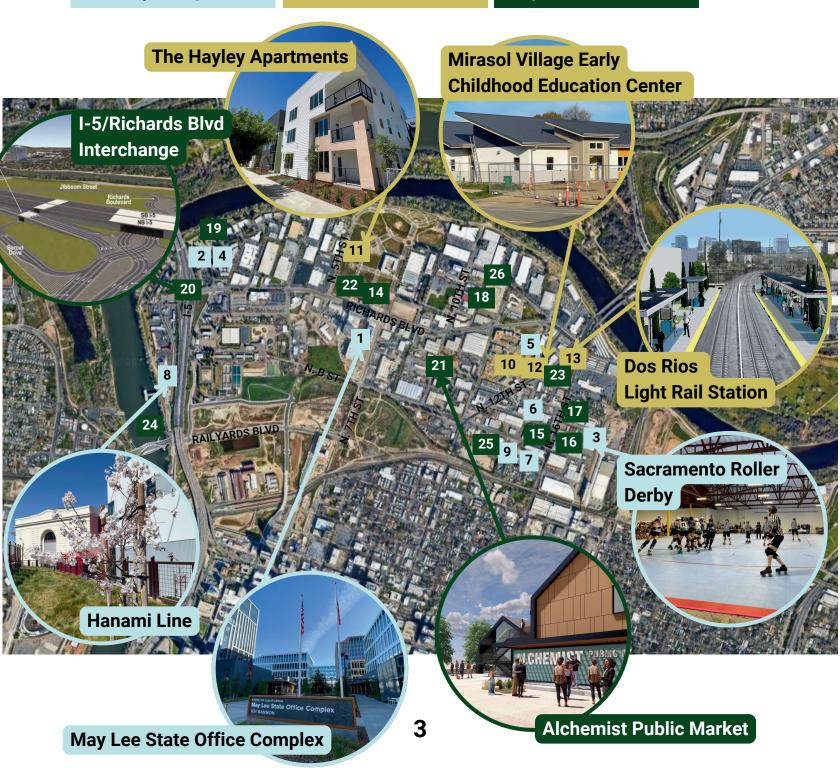

Capital Protection Group, Inc., became the River District's security partner in October, 2024.

On June 20, 2024, the Sacramento Tree Foundation proudly unveiled the Hanami Line at Robert T. Matsui Park. Over a decade in the making, this stunning cherry blossom park along the Sacramento River is a vibrant gathering space that honors the rich cultural contributions of the Japanese American community. A testament to collaboration, this project was made possible through a partnership with the City of Sacramento and the dedicated efforts of all those who brought this vision to life.

The River District debuted a new event, the **Development Update, on November 12,** 2024. Taking place at the brand new May Lee State Office Complex, the event included an overview of development in the district with presentations from SMUD, **Alchemist Community Development** Corporation, Downtown Railyards Ventures, Sacramento Republic FC, SHRA, and the City of Sacramento.



Late in 2024, it was announced that Sacramento Republic FC and city leaders plan to construct a long-awaited soccer stadium and entertainment venue in the Railyards. The proposal came to fruition with a major investment from Wilton Rancheria, which was announced as the new majority ownership group of the team. City Council unanimously approved a term sheet outlining plans to accelerate the stadium's construction in November. The current plan is for the stadium will be completed in time for the 2027 season.

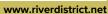

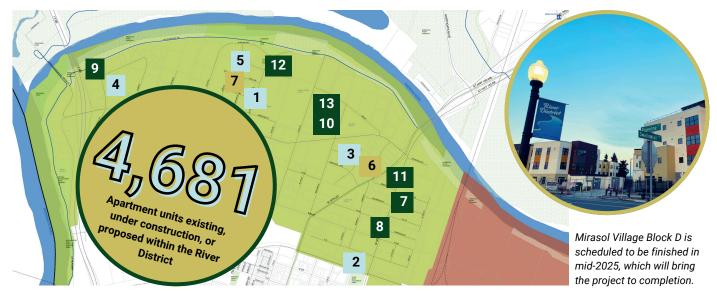

Sacramento Air Travel

Sacramento International Airport (SMF) saw a record number of passengers in 2024, with over 13.6 million travelers, representing a 5.1% increase over the previous year. The increase was partially attributed to added flights and destinations, as well as recognition from travelers outside of the community. Sacramento was recently named one of the 50 best places to travel by Travel & Leisure, taking into account the airport's large-scale expansion project currently underway.

Private security patrols of the River District are provided through a contract with Capital Protection Group, which took over from Sacramento Protective Services in October, 2024. Support from the City of Sacramento and 29th Street Capital enables our in-house Public Spaces Team to keep our district looking its best, while offering training and full time employment to our crew members who are transitioning out of homelessness and addiction.

The River District's programs are provided directly to assessed parcels above and beyond those currently provided by the City of Sacramento and other public agencies. Service levels to individual parcels are based on the amount paid into the District. Financial oversight is provided by the Executive Director and the Board of Directors.

SAFETY & MAINTENANCE

Having been awarded the Downtown Achievement Award of Excellence from the International Downtown Association and a resolution from the City of Sacramento, the Public Spaces Team continued to keep the district clean and safe while providing workforce training and skills



to its members with lived experience of homelessness and/or addiction. The team was supported by grant funding from the City of Sacramento and private contracts with property owners, as well as the PBID. Original Team Member Shawna Bowman graduated from the program in January.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The River District presented a Development Update event in the fall, hosted at the brand new May Lee State Office Complex. The presentation, which was livestreamed, included an overview of all projects currently in the pipeline, along with speakers representing several featured projects. In addition, the River District's quarterly market reports provided insights for investors, developers, retailers and brokers.

PLANNING. ADVOCACY & ENHANCEMENTS

The River District was successful in adopting its first Strategic Plan, "Confluence: The Joining of Sacramento and its Riverfront," as well as renewing the district for another ten-year term. Both of these accomplishments offer a vision and plans for the future of the district.

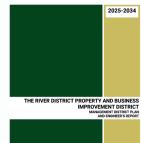
